Policy	Camper's Parent/Guardian Initials
<p>Medical agent: On behalf of my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, I, for myself and/or on behalf of my child, hereby waive, discharge and release any and all rights and claims for damages which my child and/or I may have against DYS or any other facility and their management, as well as any other person connected with DYS, their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, for any and all injuries which I/my child may suffer while taking part in DYS camps or as a result thereof. I appoint DYS Camp Director, or his/her designee, to be my agent for consenting to emergency medical care and treatment of my child in my absence. If I (or other emergency contact) am unavailable or cannot be located, our agent may consent to any medical examination, x-ray or other diagnostic procedure, anesthetic, medical or surgical procedure or treatment, or hospital care of my child that is recommended by a physician. I authorize any physician who has treated my child or any hospital in which our child has been admitted to surrender physical custody of my child to our agent. This authorization makes our agent a "person who has legal authority to consent to medical treatment or hospital care on behalf of" our child under Ohio Revised Code Section 2317.54 (C). I am giving this authorization before any specific diagnosis, treatment, or hospital care of our child is required. I intend this authorization to help make available to our child medical care and treatment that may be required in the future. I authorize Diabetes Youth Services to release or receive all medical records for the above named camper, including but not limited to those records pertaining to substance abuse and emotional or mental health. My authorization shall remain effective for the entire camp session, unless the physician or hospital acting under this authorization has been notified in writing that my authorization has been revoked.</p>	
<p>Activities: In consideration of Diabetes Youth Services ('DYS') permitting my child(ren) to participate at Diabetes Youth Services camp, and acknowledging that participating in camp and activities while at camp have inherent risks, on behalf of my child(ren), or heirs, executors, administrators and assigns of my child(ren), I hereby waive, discharge, and release any and all rights to claims for damages, losses or expenses which may exist against Diabetes Youth Services, Recreation Unlimited, Sylvania Park District/Olander Park, ProMedica Farms, or any other camp facility and their management, as well as any other person connected with Diabetes Youth Services camps or as a result thereof.</p>	
<p>Insulin: I consent to having my child follow DYS method of diabetes treatment as outlined in the "DYS Hot Shot Camper Manual" and to use approved supplies while at camp. I further agree that at DYS Hot Shots Camps, insulin must be administered--whether by injection or pump --under the direct supervision of a qualified medical staff member any time insulin is given. DYS has my permission to adjust insulin dosages while my child is at camp.</p>	
<p>Diabetes technology: DYS is not responsible for any damage to and will not replace your child's insulin pump or continuous glucose monitoring system (CGM's). If damage occurs to any of this equipment while participating in camp, your family will bear the cost of replacement. <i>We strongly encourage you to insure your child's diabetes technology by securing a "loss policy" as an addition to your homeowner's or renters insurance.</i> Homeowner's or renter's insurance covers this equipment only in very extreme circumstances. A specific loss policy will cover equipment replacement if it is lost or damaged, at home or at camp. The costs of these policies vary; please contact your insurance agent for more information. If you have insurance for your child's insulin pump or continuous glucose monitoring system, please copy the declarations page and attach to this document.</p>	

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<p>Use of CGM's:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Campers will be able to use CGM within product specifications. Medical staff at camp may ask camper to manually check their blood sugar at any time. 2. At camp, our glucose target is often higher than home glucose targets (generally <180 mg/dL). To prevent frequent alarms, we strongly recommend changing alarm parameters: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Low Alert <80 mg/dL • High Alert <250 mg/dL • Disable high prediction alert and rise rate 3. If the CGM's sensor becomes dislodged, errors, or fails, a replacement sensor will be put back on the camper at the next meal if supplies are available (activities will not be interrupted for CGMs' failure). Campers must bring their own CGM supplies. 4. The medical staff has permission to download and review CGM data for medical purposes. 5. If the CGM unit becomes a distraction, the medical staff reserves the right to turn off the CGM unit. 6. Remote monitoring by non-camp staff is highly discouraged. Follow and share functions will be turned off at check-in. At day camp sessions, we will not turn the follow feature off, however we do ask that you only contact DYS staff in a true emergency. <p>Why do we ask you to turn off your share functions?</p> <p>At the beginning of camp season, many new parents may be nervous about the idea of not monitoring your camper's BG levels while they are away from you. Rest assured, your camper is in the best care possible away from home as they are surrounded by certified endocrinology doctors, nurses, certified diabetes educators, dietary staff, and young adults who live with type 1 diabetes. Your child and their diabetes are safe at camp!</p> <p>All your camper's blood sugars are recorded and once they are back home the share feature can be turned back on and all readings from the week can be viewed. Our goal at camp is to give caregivers the opportunity to relax and not worry about their child's blood sugar for a few days out of the year. If medical staff have a question or concern, we will always contact you. Relax and take advantage of a much needed break!</p>	
<p>Cell Phone Policy:</p> <p>If your camper uses a Dexcom CGM, DYS Staff will be able to view their blood sugar from their smart devices on a camp-wide scale, similar to the Dexcom Share feature. To utilize this function the following is needed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You must provide your camper's Dexcom Share login information in the online medical forms. This form is located with all other online forms on CampWise. • DYS Staff will require some setting changes on each camper's phone, including but not limited to Siri functionality, push notifications from most apps, and phone rings and alarms being silenced. We will check each camper's phone settings at their respective check in and as needed throughout camp. • All cell phones will be secured in personal pouches to prevent access to phones unless specifically allowed by DYS Staff. DYS Staff will have the ability to unlock these bags with specialized magnets when needed. Campers may carry their cell phone on their person, but can choose to give their phones to their counselors if they prefer. • This summer, DYS may occasionally permit campers to have limited access to their cellular phone during organized activities. Depending on scheduling, behavior exhibited by the 	

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<p>camper(s), or any other outlying circumstances, campers may or may not have access to their phones, but we cannot guarantee access will be permitted for a camper.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When access is permitted, campers must stay within a designated area with DYS Staff. Campers may not take non-consensual pictures of other campers, staff, or any other person(s) on Recreation Unlimited property without explicit permission of all parties. Campers may not post photos displaying their location on social media while at camp. • Phone access is given at the discretion of DYS Staff and can be taken away for any reason at any time. If a phone is confiscated, DYS reserves the right to keep the cell phone in a secure location and will return to the campers legal guardians, or to authorized person(s) picking up camper that day. Campers may or may not have the ability to continue using Automated Insulin Delivery Systems at camp if phone is confiscated. • If protective pouches are damaged, lost, stolen, or any other circumstance where the integrity of the pouch is compromised, the billing contact provided on CampWise will be charged \$20-\$25 to replace the pouch. Campers will not be able to participate in other Hot Shots Camp sessions until that balance has been paid in full. • This policy is subject to change at the discretion of DYS Staff. We will review this policy in full at the Parent Orientation session prior to camp. <p>I understand that by allowing my camper's cell phone to come to camp the above rules will apply. I understand DYS is not liable for any phones that are lost/damaged/stolen throughout camp. I give permission for DYS to have access to my camper's cell phone at camp and can make changes to settings if needed. I understand Diabetes Youth Services or anyone acting on their behalf is not responsible for any actions taken on a camper's cellular phone while under the supervision of Diabetes Youth Services and Recreation Unlimited Staff. I give permission for DYS to enforce this policy as needed for my camper, and confiscate my camper's phone if this policy is not followed.</p>	
<p>Contact information: I give my permission for DYS to add/update my family's information in the DYS general mailing database. I also permit my child's name and contact information to be listed in a DYS Camp Directory.</p>	
<p>Pictures: I hereby give DYS, their legal representatives or assigns, and those acting under their permission and upon their authority, or those for whom DYS is acting, permission to use my/my child's picture, and if desired, my/my child's name in advertising and in all forms of publicity, without limit as to time. I, for myself and/or on behalf of my child, further release DYS from my liability for what my child and/or I might deem misrepresentation of me by virtue of alterations, optical illusions or faulty mechanical reproductions in such advertising and/or publicity.</p>	
<p>COVID Liability Consent:</p> <p>I acknowledge that while Recreation Unlimited, Olander Park, and ProMedica Farms have COVID-19 protocols in place, and while DYS staff and volunteers also will be asked to follow COVID-19 protocols, DYS cannot guarantee that my child(ren) will not contract COVID-19 while at a DYS camp or during registration and transportation to and from camp, and that there is an inherent risk of contracting COVID-19 by attending camp, and I hereby waive any liability against DYS for the same.</p>
